#### **Dollar of Loans Funded (in Millions)**






#### # of Loans in Portfolio

CSS Foundation, Spokane Community College -The Running Start for Careers initiative raises scholarship funds for students earning a college trade degree and high school diploma at the same time.


This grant will provide scholarship funds for low-income students go to college and get a vocational degree to kick start their careers.
